
# How to Trace the Owner of a Georgia Phone Number for Free: A Step-by-Step Guide

# **S** Country Code

All U.S. numbers, including those from Georgia, begin with the **country code +1** when dialed from outside the country. This code tells you the number is based in the United States.

#### **Example:**

+1-404-XXX-XXXX  $\rightarrow$  The **+1** shows that the call is coming from a U.S.-based number — like one from Georgia.

# Area Code (NPA - Numbering Plan Area)

The first three digits of a 10-digit phone number represent the **area code**. Georgia uses multiple area codes that cover metro areas, suburbs, and rural counties — and each one can give you a strong hint about where the number originated.

#### **Common Georgia Area Codes:**

- 404 / 470 / 678 / 943 Atlanta and metro suburbs
- 706 / 762 Northern and west-central Georgia (Columbus, Rome, Augusta outskirts)
- **912** Southeastern Georgia (Savannah, Brunswick)
- **229** Southwestern Georgia (Albany, Valdosta)
- 478 Central Georgia (Macon, Warner Robins)

#### **Example:**

912-555-XXXX  $\rightarrow$  The **912** area code tells you the number likely originates from Georgia's southeastern region.

# Prefix Number (NXX – Central Office Code)

The next set of three digits — called the **prefix** — reveals even more about where the call is coming from. These numbers are tied to specific towns, carriers, or regions within an area code.

#### **Example:**

404-872-XXXX → The prefix **872** could indicate a number registered in midtown Atlanta.

By combining the area code and prefix, you can **narrow down the caller's location to a specific city or even a neighborhood**.

# Subscriber Number

The final four digits in any U.S. number are the **subscriber number**. This sequence is unique to the individual user or device but doesn't offer geographic clues on its own.

#### **Example:**

 $229-888-4321 \rightarrow$  The **4321** is the specific phone line identifier for that user, used in combination with the area code and prefix to fully trace the number.

#### Step 4: Subscriber Number - 4391

The last four digits — **4391** — are unique to the individual or business line but don't offer location clues on their own. However, when combined with the **area code and prefix**, they form a fully traceable number.

#### Full number trace so far: 404 (Atlanta) + 872 (Midtown) + 4391 (individual line)
